In this classic biographical romance, set for the most part in the bed sitting-room of the ailing versifier, Miss Browning tells how she and how she and Robert Browning were able to triumph in their undying love for each other. GAY EVE ARDEN, WHO STARS AS CONNIE BROOKS, romantic English teacher of Madison High, and Jeff Chandler, the bashful Philip Boynton, biology instructor and object of her affections, will be heard in their lovable impersonations on CBS' hilarious comedy "Our Miss Brooks." KTSA-3:30 P.M.

JACK BENNY WILL DO A VERSION of "Ah, Wilderness!" Eugene O'Neill's stage classic of adolescence in a typical American family in 1906, on CBS' Sunday. Mary Livingstone, Phil Harris, Rochester, Dennis Day, and Don Wilson join in the funfest. KTSA-6 P.M.

RAY MILLAND WILL BE STARRED IN "The Enchanted Cottage" as this Sunday's offering of The Theatre Guild on the Air. Written by Arthur Wing Pinero, "The Enchanted Cottage" was first produced in London in 1922. A year later it was presented on the New York stage. It is the moving story of a relationship between a wounded, disfigured war veteran and a homely girl. Featured with Milland in the radio version will be Margaret Phillips and John Carradine.
