The competition opened Aug. 25 with calls for photographs of girls born in 1934, the year "Lux Radio Theatre" made its debut. Thousands of portraits were received, and from these six were chosen by local committees in each area. Of each sextette, a finalist was selected in voting by the public. The finalists were announced on the broadcast of "Lux Radio Theatre" Monday, Nov. 21.

At many CBS stations, receptions were held for the winners and runners-up. At KNX in Hollywood, the sextette attended the "Lux Radio Theater" broadcast and afterward went backstage to meet Lucille Ball and Bob Hope, stars of "Sorrowful Jones," and producer William Keighley. The national winner will receive as her prize a 10-day visit to the film capital during the Christmas holidays, parties, a wardrobe, screen and television tests.
