## Winter Balm Lures Adman To California

Ken Carpenter became an announcer because of winter

weather. On New Year's Day, 1928, Carnenter, who is announcer of KTSA-CBS' "Bing Crosby Program" and "Amos 'n' Andy," was sitting by his fireside in Peoria, Ill., listening to a Rose Bowl football game broadcast. The late Graham MacNamee's colorful description of California and its perfect weather intrigued

An advertising man, he moved lo California, got a job as an announcer. Subsequently, he won fame as a sportscaster. He had his face marked by cleats at a Rose Bowl game, nearly drowned on Navy Day, and was kicked by Azucar, winner of the first Santa Anita Handicap, in 1935. It was his description of that race that earned him his spot on the Crosby show.
