Gable Stars In Story of Air Force

The suspenseful "Command Decision" with the stars of the original film cast—Clark Gable, Van Johnson, John Hodiak, Walter Pidgeon and Edward Arnold—will be the "Screen Guild Theater" offering Thursday, at 8 p.m., over WOAI.

This story of an American bomber command in London during World War II was first published as a novel, later was produced on Broadway, where it was an outstanding hit, and last year was successfully filmed.

The central figure is Brig. Gen. K. C. Dennis (Clark Gable), who in the temporary absence of his superior, Gen. Kane (Walter Pidgeon), orders the daylight precision bombing which is later recognized as an important turning-point in the war against Germany.

He suffers wide criticism over bomber losses to enemy flak and fighters before daylight bombing is visualized as playing such an important part in the course of the war.

"Skippy Hollywood Theater," starring leading screen personalities in original half hour dramas, makes its premiere broadcast over CBS and KTSA Thursday, from 9:30 to 10:00 p.m.

Les Mitchell, producer-director of the series, is in London to record six programs starting top British actors, including John Mills, Jean Simmons, Margaret Lockwood and Clive Brook, of the Abbey Players. Arrangements for the venture, believed unique in the history of radio drama, were made through the J. Arthur Rank organization. The six-program series will mark the Abbey Players' first group air appearances in the United States.

Two Hollywood-originating shows are scheduled for Thursday and Dec. 8, with the London programs slated to begin Dec. 15, when a British cast headed by Margaret Lockwood, Jean Simmons and Trevor Howard will perform "Christmas Carol." Also on Mitchell's London agenda is a story written especially for the British cast by Joseph Cochrane, who has authored several other "Skippy" scripts.

Van Desautel announces "Skippy Hollywood Theater," and Del Castillo is musical arranger and conductor.
