# On the Air Waves

## N. D.-S. M. U. Highlights Radio Grid Season Windup

NEW YORK, Dec. 2. (AP) In their windup of the regular college football season tomorrow afternoon three radio networks are dividing attention between two games. Schedule details are:

NBC and CBS—Notre Dame vs. Southern Methodist at Dallas, Texas. Bill Stern talking for NBC and Red Barber for CBS.  
MBS—Alabama vs. Auburn at Birmingham, Al Helfer and Bob Wolff announcing.

Upon the television scene: Dumont, which a year ago set up a full daytime TV schedule, then after a trial period curtailed it sharply, has decided to reverse again. Beginning next Monday it expects to add two hours to the afternoon list, Mondays through Fridays.

Among the newest of the television stations is WTTV, Bloomington, Ind., owned by Sarkes and Mary Tarzian. It claims to be the first TV station to start up in a town the size of Bloomington which also is the site of Indiana University. WTTV is Indiana's second station, the other being WFBM-TV at Indianapolis.

Scheduled for tonight: NBC transcription of address delivered earlier by Vice President Barkley at fundraising dinner under auspices of the Democratic national committee in New York.  
ABC radio and NBC-TV Friday boxing again returns to New York, both radio and television handling the same event instead of separate bouts when out-of-town broadcasts are scheduled; principals are Roland Lastraza and Cesar Brion, heavyweights.

Also this new one for tonight's television: NBC-TV first of a bi-weekly series, "TV Detective," mystery show to include guests who will be asked to solve the crime just before the final scene.

To fill a half-hour gap in its Sunday night music schedule, MBS is arranging to present a series of concerts in co-operation with ECA under the title of "This is Europe." Each week music of a different country will be played by a 45-piece orchestra directed

# Careless Play of Ace Cost Experts Loss of This Hand

I secured today's hand from the little black book of maestro Harry J. Fishbein himself. Remember, earlier in the week when he said that carelessness was a definite weakness in a player's game? That thought also has been expressed by E. Jay Becker, and every expert keeps it well in mind.

Fishbein gave me today's hand, and it is one in which carelessness could easily cost you your contract. Before getting into the play, he pointed out that the five-spade bid by South was a cue bid, showing the ace of spades. This was made not with the idea

of just getting to six, but asking if there was a possibility of playing the hand at seven. However, North decided six was enough on the hand.

The night this hand was played in one of the duplicate games at the Mayfair Bridge Club, Fishbein said that at every table the declarer, on the opening lead of the king of spades, played the ace of spades from dummy, and naturally lost his contract. It was trumped and declarer still had a diamond to lose.

All the declarer has to do is to play low to the first trick. When East continues with the queen of spades, declarer should play low from dummy and trump in his own hand.

He then runs all the trump, getting himself down to four diamonds and two clubs. I have underlined the cards in the balance of the hands. He now leads a club and wins with the king, cashes the ace of spades, declarer discarding a diamond.

West is helpless. If he discards a diamond, declarer will have three good diamond tricks. If West discards the ten of clubs, this will establish an extra club trick in the dummy.
