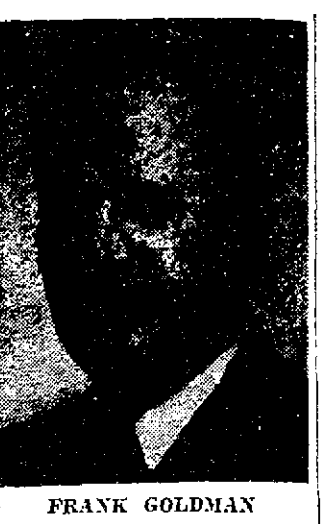

HEBREW CENTER LISTENING PARTY ON ANNIVERSARY

A variety of attractions are featured at the "Listening-In Party" which is open to members and prospective members of the B'nai B'rith, which will be held Sunday afternoon, at 3 p.m., at the Hebrew Community Center, 112 East Quincy Street.

This feature broadcast observes the hundred and sixth anniversary of the B'nai B'rith and stars Jack Benny. Frank Goldman, national B'nai B'rith president, will take a major role in this radio feature program which will dramatize the history of this national fraternal order, which is the oldest and largest Jewish service organization in the world. Goldman will present a citation to Benny for his outstanding service to our country.

Top-flight radio writers, artists and directors, such as Himan Brown and Allen Sloane, participated in creating this public service feature. Radio station KTSA will broadcast this program as a public service airer this Sunday, at 3:30 p.m.

Preceding the broadcast, Cantor Irving Dean, who has won wide acclaim, will chant several popular Hebrew melodies. Cantor Dean, who was recently elected by Congregation Rodfei Shalom will be accompanied by Mrs. Dorothy Ghetzler. He studied music at Columbia University, New York and attended the Yeshivah University, New York.

As another feature of this meeting, Louis J. Riklin, state chairman of the Anti-Defamation League, will discuss some of the current activities being investigated by this group.

Howard Sacks, vice-president of the local lodge, will be chairman of the "Listening-In Party." Following the broadcast, a social hour will be held and refreshments will be served. Games are being arranged to be played after the meeting.

LEOPOLD STOKOWSKI CONDUCTS THE NEW YORK PHILHARMONIC-SYMPHONY IN the radio premiere of Prokofiev's "Symphony No. 6," on KTSA Sunday 2:00-3:30 p.m. (FM) —10:30 p.m.—12:00 p.m. (AM).

The eminent American violinist Isaac Stern is soloist in the "Haydn Concerto in C Major." Mr. Stokowski also directs the orchestra in Bach's "Passacaglia" and "Fugue in C Minor." Mr. Stern also is guest of James Fasset in the "Green Room at Carnegie Hall" intermission feature. Just returned from an extensive European tour, the violinist will discuss musical conditions abroad, emphasizing the responsibilities of the American artist today. The Haydn Violin Concerto, composed between 1766 and 1769, has not been played by the Philharmonic since 1910. At that time, it was programmed as "only recently discovered," having lain for more than 140 years in a heap of dust-covered manuscripts in the garret of the Breitkopf publishing house in Leipzig. ANNE ELSTNER, STAR AND TITLE PLAYER OF NBC'S "STELLA DALLAS," WILL portray an entirely different type of woman—a crotchety invalid—in "Local Storm" on NBC's "Radio City Playhouse" Sunday. James Susssex wrote the radio play which concerns a rich, elderly shut-in who has been unable to walk for many years. Deserted by servants and friends, she becomes increasingly panicky during a storm when her life is threatened by an intruder. WOAI—4 P.M.

SCREEN STAR TYRONE POWER, WHO RECENTLY RETURNED TO Hollywood after an extended film-making sojourn in Italy, exchanges quips with comedian Jack Benny on KTSA's "Jack Benny Program" Sunday. Mindful of Al Jolson's success in having Larry Parks play his life on the screen, the Waukegan Wit calls on Power at his home to induce him to do the role of Jack Benny in a movie titled "The Life of Jack Benny." All of Benny's regulars contribute to the banter, including Mary Livingstone, Phil Harris, Rochester, Don Wilson and Dennis Day, who will sing "I've Got a Lovely Bunch of Coconuts." KTSA—6 P.M.
