U. S. Takes Over Tucker Corp. Plant

CHICAGO—(U.R)—Any hope of Torpedo" automobile collapsed Monday when the government took physical possession of the war-surplus plant where Preston Tucker founded his illfated Tucker Corp.

Tucker and seven associates now are on trial in federal court on mail fraud and conspiracy charges in the attempt to build the new rear-engined car.

Federal Judge Michael L. Igoe Oct. 4 approved return of the Tucker plant to the War Assets Administration (WAA), but gave court-appointed trustees 60 days in which to attempt to sell Tucker's WAA lease or effect a reorganziation.

The deadline on Igoe's order expired Sunday with no action taken. The plant still contained some \$2.500,000 worth of equipment and accessories of the firm. which must be removed by the


