His opener gave every indication that the radio show he dispensed so long should do even better visually. Basically it is the same program, a quiz with contestants and musical embellishments.

There have been changes, not too many, through the insertion of certain visual elements for the benefit of an audience that now can see as it listens.

The TV series marks Kay's return to the air, his most recent run having been on the A.B.C. daytime radio schedule. Also it brings him back to N.B.C., on whose radio hookup his original college had a decade of nighttime broadcasting.
