Philippines Curbs Foreign Exchange

BY ASSOCIATED PRESS MANILA, Dec. 9.—The Philippine government, with the blessings of the U.S. and the International Monetary Fund, Friday clamped strict controls on foreign exchange. Authoritative sources said the move was precipitated by the flight of large sums of money from the Philippines in recent weeks in apparent fear that the peso will be devalued. Most of the capital went to the United States. The peso is pegged at two to \$1 U.S. These sources, who would not let their names be used, said there was no plan now to devalue it.
