

15-Year-Old Beauty Catapults to Fame

Jackie Lee Barnes, of Albuquerque, N. Mex., lifted overnight from the obscurity of a small-city schoolgirl's life as a result of her selection as America's most beautiful 15-year-old miss in a contest held by CBS' "Lux Radio Theater," now is the focus of interest of millions of fellow teenagers from New York to Hollywood.

The announcement of her triumph in the nationwide beauty competition staged by "Lux Radio Theater" in connection with its 15th anniversary season was made on the program last week.
