On the Air Waves

Protest Crime Shows on TV

WASHINGTON, (AP)—Los Angeles television stations during a recent week broadcast no less than 61 murder shows. A Los Angeles citizens group has informed the communications commission. The Southern California Association for Better Radio and Television, through its president, Mrs. Clara S. Logan, sent the commission a log yesterday of "violence and crime" programs it logged during the week ending Nov. 11. It showed: "Ninety-one murders, seven staged holdups, three kidnappings, 10 thefts, four burglaries, two cases of arson, two larceny breaks, one murder by explosion of 15 to 20 people, two suicides, one case of blackmail, cases of assault and battery too numerous to tabulate, also cases of attempted murder."

It was accompanied by letters to six Los Angeles and Hollywood stations asking if they would not "substitute acceptable programs which would be suitable for family viewing and listening." The file included a letter to KFI-TV expressing thanks to the station for not using "old time serials and crime programs."

FCC released the file without comment.

Bill Welsh to Conduct New Video Morning Show



Bill Welsh, known to every Southern Californian who owns a television set and to most of those who own a radio set, was revealed today as the personality who will conduct KFI-TV's new morning program.

The station started Monday and will telecast continuously Monday through Friday from 9 a. m. to 6 p. m. The station has been on in the afternoons since March 1 and will continue to operate in the afternoons on Sunday and Saturday.

Welsh's three-hour stint (9 a. m. to noon) will be a compilation of audience participation, interviews with outstanding personalities and recorded music. Winner of two awards in the 1949 mid-year poll, the M. C. of "Meet Me In Hollywood" is one of the best-known personalities in west coast television.

It was through his sports announcing that Welsh came to television. His first television assignments were telecasting ice hockey, from which he branched into presenting all types of sports—the professional football games, A. A. U. basketball and miscellaneous events.

His 27-hour grind in reporting the efforts to save Kathy Fiscus spotlighted Welsh as an outstanding on-the-spot reporter. It was

... that he won his spurs in the radio business in Denver from 1933 to 1943 as director of news, sports and special events for KFEI, and later as sports and special events announcer for KOA.

Following a year with the OWI as regional director for a six-state area headquartered at Denver, Welsh came to California. He became senior announcer for an oil company's football and basketball broadcasts.

I was in December, 1947, that Welsh took his stand at Hollywood and Vine to talk to the public, quickly winning one of the largest audiences in television.
