NEW YORK. A control room engineer for the Office of War Information means that you are hidden back among a lot of gadgets, switches and such machines where you seldom have a chance to find out how many kilowatts it takes to watch a fetching blonde cross the street.

Jeff Clark, a good looking guy who found himself in this predicament, decided to come out in the open and so became the singing star of NBC's "Your Hit Parade." It came about because he was always singing in that control room at OWI and a manager of Rudy Vallee heard him warbling during rehearsals of an overseas program one day and advised him to put aside his kilowatts and concentrate on singing. Clark first spent six months with a singing coach and that landed him six months with Henry Morgan. Now the 24-year-old youngster is well on his way.

Mary Martin, the chick in "South Pacific" is a baseball fan and we were discussing batting averages, the terrific box office figures of her show and other such atomic mathematics. I commented that it had been quite some time since a baseball or other sports star had made an attempt to become an actor, as Jack Dempsey did.

His play closed after three weeks, run with the audiences consisting mostly of Matty's pals.

Talking with Moira Shearer, star of the ballet movie, "The Red Shoes," I thought it was giving her a compliment when I said that her performance is "very artistic." But she turned up her cute nose at the description.

"I do not like that adjective; 'artistic.' It reminds me of something that Lillian Russell once wrote to her sister after her sister had seen Nijinsky dance," Miss Shearer said. "Miss Russell wrote: 'I've seen Nijinsky dance. You are right. He is artistic. In fact, he is so artistic, he doesn't do anything but pose.'"
