98th TV Station in U. S. Begins Operating Saturday

NEW YORK, Dec. 16. (AP) Last of the year's additions to the television station list comes Saturday with the formal opening of WXEL at Cleveland, that city's third station and the 98th for the nation.
WXEL already has been on the air with test programs, including network relays from ABC and Dumont, with both of which it is affiliated.
The 97th station, WOAI-TV at San Antonio, which increases the TV cities to 58 now is in the fifth day of regular operation. It has network affiliations with NBC, CBS and ABC.
While WXEL can pick up network programs on direct relay, WOAI-TV puts on such shows by means of film transmissions. Network facilities have not yet been extended to that area.
Opening of these stations completes the year's roster just two short of the anticipated first hundred. That figure is not expected to materialize until some time after New Year's. So far five California stations have indicated tentative starting date for early 1950, with Ice.
