Single Unit Law May Meet Test If Need Arises

The county commissioners Friday divvied up the \$306,400 road and bridge fund which included a "gentleman's agreement" to refrain from any transfers from one precinct to another during 1951.

That agreement has no legal force, of course, since the law dictates that the county road system must be treated as a single unit. If a need arises and the commissioners fail to meet it, the answer is obvious.

But, as of Friday, the fund was allocated for 1951 thus: Precinct 1. \$81,000: Precinct 2, \$73,200; Precinct 3 \$,73,200; and

Precinct 4, \$79,000. The allocation further provides that Precinct 1 and 4 will transfer to Precinct 2 \$1,656 each to pay for a highway patrolman-or to go into the road and bridge fund of that precinct in event a patrolman is not employed.

That brings up another point The highway patrolmen get their commissions from the sheriff. Com. Sam Bennett had no patrolman in 1949 because the sheriff declined to commission him. A suit is pending to settle that question in the case of Jack Higdon, employed as patrolman in Precinct 1

The question of transfers was brought up by Com. R. L. Reader, who has been gun shy since the other three commissioners raided his fat surplus of \$50,000 about two months ago. They put the money in the southern end of the county to repair washouts on roads there.

Reader won a moral victory there by getting the money back and then giving back \$40,000 but he was still out that much

Under the law, each commissioner is just as responsible for roads in other precincts as he is for the ones in the precinct in which he resides. In practice, he commissioners have been little concerned about roads other than in his own precinct. The new division of funds has
