County Fathers Divvy Up Road, Bridge Money

Single Unit Law May Meet Test If Need Arises

The county commissioners Friday divvied up the \$306,400 road and bridge fund which included a "gentleman's agreement" to refrain from any transfers from one precinct to another during 1951.

That agreement has no legal force, of course, since the law dictates that the county road system must be treated as a single unit. If a need arises and the commissioners fail to meet it, the answer is obvious.

But, as of Friday, the fund was allocated for 1951 thus: Precinct 1, \$81,000; Precinct 2, \$73,200; Precinct 3, \$73,200; and Precinct 4, \$79,000.

The allocation further provides that Precinct 1 and 4 will transfer to Precinct 2 \$1,656 each to pay for a highway patrolman—or to go into the road and bridge fund of that precinct in event a patrolman is not employed.

That brings up another point. The highway patrolmen get their commissions from the sheriff. Com. Sam Bennett had no patrolman in 1949 because the sheriff declined to commission him. A suit is pending to settle that question in the case of Jack Higdon, employed as patrolman in Precinct 1.

The question of transfers was brought up by Com. R. L. Reader, who has been gun-shy since the other three commissioners raided his fat surplus of \$50,000 about two months ago. They put the money in the southern end of the county to repair washouts on roads there.

Reader won a moral victory there by getting the money back and then giving back \$40,000, but he was still out that much cash.

Under the law, each commissioner is just as responsible for roads in other precincts as he is for the ones in the precinct in which he resides. In practice, the commissioners have been little concerned about roads other than in his own precinct.

The new division of funds has done little to correct that situation.

Available funds will do little more than maintain existing roads. The county engineer has estimated \$5,000,000 would be necessary to put county roads in good shape.

Yardage Fees To Be Raised At Stockyards

Livestock shippers to the San Antonio market will be faced with higher yardage charges after Jan. 1, under terms of a new tariff posted at the San Antonio stockyards this week.

Advances ranging from one cent per head for sheep and goats to 43 cents per head for bulls have been given approval by the Packers & Stockyards Administration. For the first time, bulls are being classed apart from cattle in the new scale of charges on yardage. Heretofore they have been classed along with cattle.

Under the new schedule, the yardage fee for marketing bulls of more than 600 pounds will be \$1 per head. When classed with cattle under present schedules the charge is 57 cents per head. The cost of marketing cattle after Jan. 1 will be 70 cents per head instead of 57 cents at present. A five cent hike, from 40 to 45 cents, has been posted on calves and a similar hike from 29 to 34 cents will apply on hogs. Sheep and goat costs will move from 14 cents to 15 cents.

New Expressway Bonds Won't Be Sold Soon

None of the recently voted \$3,850,000 Expressway right-of-way and bridge bond issue will be offered for sale until after the Jan. 24 charter election, Street Com. James W. Knight said Friday. The addition to the city's legal staff to handle right-of-way matters also will be delayed until that time, he added.

John Zeller, the city's agent in the purchase of right-of-way, said he is now running the route of the San Antonio Expressway segment from Herff St. to Nogalitos St. but that none of the property owners will be contacted until after the sale of the recently voted bonds. He estimated the cost of the right-of-way on that segment at about \$800,000.

Zeller said he is working in close co-operation with J. L. Dickson, Expressway engineer-manager, and that assurance has been given that this delay in offering the bond issue for sale will not delay the final completion of the Expressway project. He said money is now available to finance construction work on the Herff St.-Nogalitos St. segment and the right-of-way can be obtained by the time the state is ready to award contract for the work. Funds for constructing the Expressway segment from Camaron St. eastward to the city limit is expected to be provided in the state-federal fund allocation next year.

Funds for the construction of the northwesterly extension of Hicks Ave., to connect U. S. Hwy 181 and 281 with Probandit St. and the Expressway will not come from the Expressway allocation, Knight said. Application for the Hicks Ave. work and for the relocated U. S. 87 will be made at a January meeting of the State Highway Commission, which will finance this work if the application is granted. Several months may elapse between the application date and the awarding of the contract.

For that reason, Knight said, there may be no pressure soon to acquire right-of-way for these two projects.

Knight said the first jobs to be financed will be the Herff St.-Nogalitos Expressway segment and the four bridges, two of them being a part of Probandit St. (South San Antonio traffic artery). These projects will cost the City of San Antonio but little more than \$1,000,000. "That will be the limit of our marketing of the recently voted bond issue," said Knight. It may be several months before additional bonds will be marketed, he added.

Zeller who has begun the preparation of files on right-of-way purchases has moved his office to 2015 Transit Tower for convenience. He said he will devote all his time to this job. His commission will be 3 per cent.

FROM EXPERIENCE
