Commonwealth Rate Hearings to Resume

Hearings on the application of the Commonwealth Telephone Co. for a rate boost will be resumed at Wausau on Jan. 31 and in Madison Feb. 7, the state Public Service Commission (PSC) announced Friday afternoon.

The Wausau hearing was scheduled to give rural telephone company owners and subscribers a chance to be heard on Commonwealth's proposed new rates. PSC Chairman John Doerfer said.

The utility, which headquarters in Madison, serves more than 80,000 subscribers through 124 exchanges. Many small farmer-owned telephone companies operate as given exchange service by Commonwealth.

The company presented its case for an estimated \$25,000 a year rate boost as hearings opened Thursday in Madison. Opponents of the increase asked for a 90-day adjournment of the hearing.
