NEW YORK, Dec. 17.—Hard coal wage contract negotiations Friday recessed their conferences until Monday afternoon without reaching an agreement. Both the operators and representatives of the United Mine Workers' Union said their two weeks of meetings had resulted in further clarification of issues. At the close of the sessions of the previous two days they announced that there had been some progress. Further details have not been given. John L. Lewis, U.M.W. president, did not appear at Friday's conference.

Steel Tuna Clipper Sinks; Crew Saved

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Dec. 17.—The tuna clipper Dominator was reported Friday to have sunk off Central America Monday. It was the first all steel vessel in the San Diego fishing fleet. The San Diego Packing Company, for which it fished, said no details of the sinking at the Galapagos Islands had been received. A radio message said all 14 of the crew had been taken aboard another San Diego clipper, the Sun Voyager.

THE ELEVENTH ANNUAL PRESENTATION OF GEORGE Friedrich Handel's oratorio "The Messiah" will be given by the Independence Messiah Choir of Kansas City on CBS Sunday. It will be sung by the 280-voice choir with members of the Kansas City Philharmonic Orchestra, under the direction of Franklin S. Weddle. The soloists will be Josephine Crinklaw Mader, soprano; Harriet Porter Moore, contralto; Garland Tickemeyer, tenor; and John McDonald, basso. The Independence Messiah Choir was founded in 1916 with a group of 160 singers. It has grown in importance and in size to its present membership of 280 voices, which include five of the original choir members. THE FIRST RADIO ADAPTATION OF ANY MAJOR work by Thomas Wolfe will be presented on "NBC Theater" Sunday. The dramatization: "You Can't Go Home Again." Norman Cousins, editor of Saturday Review of Literature, will comment on Wolfe's work at intermission. "You Can't Go Home Again," the last of Wolfe's novels, was published in 1940, two years after his death. It has been described as a novel about a lost modern who found himself. Wolfe called the book a hopeful one: "You can't go back home to escape time and memory; the real home of everyone is in the future. Virtually all of Wolfe's work is autobiographical or semi-autobiographical, characterized by intense individualism and exuberance of spirit. Claris A. Ross of the network's Script Division has adapted "You Can't Go Home Again" for "NBC Theater." **WOAI-6 P.M.**

Railroaders Cast Strike Ballots

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 17.—About 20,000 railroad workers in this area began casting ballots Friday in a nation-wide strike vote for a 40-hour work week with no reduction in pay. Word of the balloting came from Charles J. Jenkins, general chairman of the Trainmen's "Terminal Railroad Association Division. He said the strike vote was being taken by the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen and the Order of Railway Conductors. He added that the action was authorized Thursday in Chicago. It was learned coincident with his announcement that W. P. Kennedy, international president, had arrived in St. Louis—presumably to supervise the voting.
