A CAST OF CELEBRATED BRITISH PLAYERS WILL BE FEATURED WHEN CBS' "Skippy Hollywood Theater" dramatizes Charles Dickens' Yuletide classic, "A Christmas Carol," Thursday over K.T.S.A. Playing leading roles in Dickens' story of the transformation of Scrooge from a miserly old crank to a man of generosity and good will are John Mills, Jean Simmons, Goggin Withers, Alec Guinness, John McCullum, Derek Bond and Derk Bogarde. Mills will be narrator and Guinness will be heard as Scrooge. With Director Mitchell serving as host, the program will feature music by Sidney Touch and the British Broadcasting Corporation Chorus. THE STORY OF HOW THE EVER-POPULAR CHRISTMAS CAROL "Silent Night" was written and how it was carried to nearly every country of the world will be told on CBS' "Hallmark Playhouse" in a special Christmas presentation, "Silent Night," Thursday over K.T.S.A.
