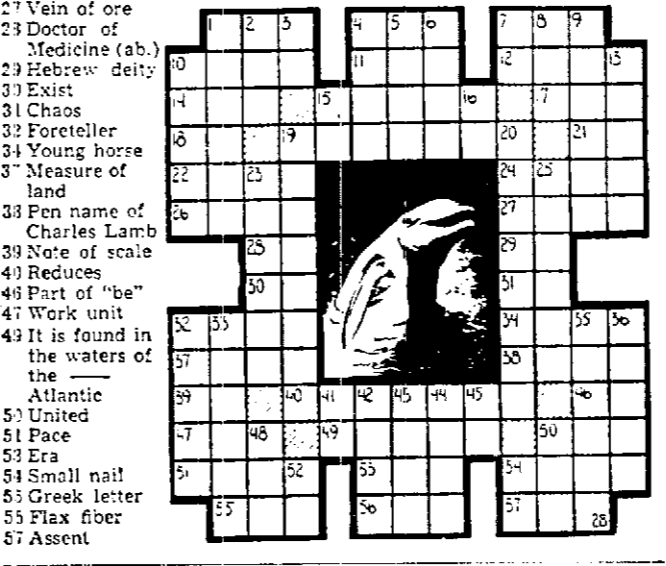

position, to figure West with a seven-card spade suit and not fair Bridge Club in New York. You will see immediately that when West opens the nine of diamonds, North plays the ten, East covers with the queen, declarer wins with the king and he is automatically down. When South leads a heart East is going to win with the ace and if he returns a diamond West will ruff it.

But do you know that not one of the East players returned a diamond? They all decided to lay down the king of spades first, then they were going to return a diamond. Of course the king of spades was trumped and the balance of the tricks were claimed by declarer.

If you just stop to think what is South bidding six hearts on? He is off the ace of trump and also a spade trick. It may be hard for you, sitting in the East
