

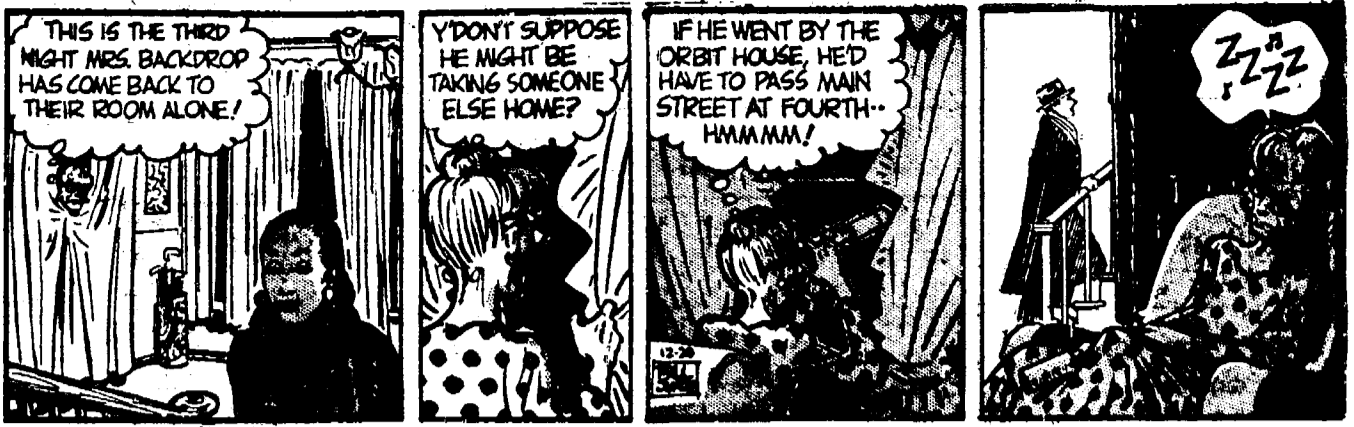

## Madison's '50 Tax Bills Ready for Mailing Jan. 5 or 6

Madison's 1950 tax bills probably will be mailed out to property owners Jan. 5 or 6, City Treas. D. John Leigh announced Tuesday afternoon when City Clerk A. W. Bareis completed and certified the tax roll.

Bareis' certification showed a corrected assessed valuation of \$196,995,288, including \$359,858,559 in real estate values and \$37,336,670 in personal property.

The tax roll totals \$6,697,119, Bareis announced, including \$6,500,880.19 in property taxes and \$196,239 in special assessments. The real estate tax accounts for \$5,268,757 and the personal property tax for \$1,232,122.

The \$196,239 special assessment total includes \$19,314 to be collected for the town of Madison, Bareis said.

## 10,000 Fans Greet Gable, Bride Upon Arrival in Hawaii

HONOLULU, T. H. — (UP)—Clark Gable, the perennial matinee idol, and his twice-titled ex-manquin bride arrived on their honeymoon Tuesday to be welcomed by a screaming crowd of 10,000 island fans.

All of the city's police reserves were on hand to control the crowd at Pier 11 when the Matson liner Lurline docked.

The graying Gable and his bride, Lady Sylvia Stanley, widow of Douglas Fairbanks, Sr., waved gaily to the mob and posed for photographers before they were whisked away in a police-escorted convertible.

Both radiated honeymoon bliss while they talked with reporters aboard the ship. Asked what present he received on Christmas day aboard ship, Gable threw his arms around his bride and declared: "This... the best Christmas present a man could have."

Their convertible, escorted by six Honolulu motorcycle policemen, took them to the same rented home in the exclusive Kahala district where Movie Star James Stewart recently honeymooned.

The 48-year-old Gable surprised Hollywood and a number of girl friends a week ago when he took his bride in a sudden and secret marriage ceremony at a dude ranch near Solvang, Calif.

## Trempealeau Acts to Recover Part of Embezzlement

WHITESHALL—(UP)—A plan to settle a suit by Trempealeau county against its former treasurer to recover part of a money embezzled by an ex-county clerk was revealed here Tuesday.

Because of the proposal, a trial in the case will not open today as scheduled. The settlement plan will be outlined to the county board at a special meeting Thursday night.

The former county clerk, Roy Matson, now is serving a one to 10-year term at Waupun for embezzling more than \$16,000 in county funds.

The money included \$7,225 paid in county checks to the state conservation department to settle Matson's personal account with the department for the sale of game licenses.

Parties in the case have proposed a stipulation allowing a judgment against County Treas. August Knudson and his bonding company if the county can't collect the \$7,255 from the conservation department.
