THE BLIND MEN AND THE ELEPHANT

There is a very ancient fable about the three blind men who described an elephant. The one who examined his tail thought the elephant was a very different sort of beast from that described by the ones who examined his ears and trunk.

Thoroughbred racing, too, is many things to many people.

racing is the source from which the 78 State, county and citrus fairs of California derive virtually their entire support. There were only nine fairs in California when racing was legalized in 1933. Racing has paid vast revenue to the State in direct taxes, without which the 78 California fairs could not possibly exist.

To educators, racing has been the means of procuring material support and improvement for the University of California Agricultural College at Davis, the California Polytechnic School at San Luis Obispo and its citrus branch at San Dimas, as well as other State
