Radio Luxembourg Giving Stuff BBC Competition

By ERNEST AGNEW LONDON. (AP) Little Radio Luxembourg is stepping out as a real competitor for the monopolistic British Broadcasting Corp.—in the BBC's own back yard. Luxembourg is competing with the BBC for the English radio listener so it can sell more radio advertising time to British firms.

The B. B. C., which runs all radio in Britain, is non-commercial and carries no advertising. Luxembourg, located 400 miles across the channel from Britain, says it is competing successfully by offering livelier programs than the B. B. C. "We concentrate on giving the English listener, particularly on Sundays, what he wants," says Luxembourg Advertising Manager Frank Lee, an Englishman. "We think he wants good dance bands, funny comedians, Hollywood and British film stars and top-flight plays. Listener surveys show we're right."

As a contrast, on a recent Sunday program Luxembourg broadcast transcriptions of a musical show featuring Gracie Fields, one of Britain's top entertainers; a play starring Margaret Lockwood, British film star; "Hollywood Calling" presenting Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer stars; Allan Jones and the Luton Girls Choir, both highly popular over here; three dance bands with 50 minutes of dance tunes; John Mills, another British film star and producer in a story-telling program, and a sports review, Lee says.

Pastor Is Pioneer Radio Broadcaster

Dr. Charles E. Fuller, well known Los Angeles pastor and originator and principal speaker of "The Old-fashioned Revival Hour," is celebrating his 25th year of broadcasting. With the radio industry hardly older than that, Dr. Fuller is regarded as a real pioneer in the field.
