Parrs Lose Bid For Tax Refund

Federal Dist. Judge Ben H. Rice, Jr., has found for the government in an opinion returned in the George Parr civil suit seeking judgement for income tax "illegally and erroneously" exacted.

Parr and his wife, Thelma D. Parr, had asked in separate suits a judgement for the sum of \$93,173.34, which they claimed the government has overcharged them for the calendar year 1944. In the complaints, filed here June 2, 1949, they asked interest at 6 per cent per annum from Aug. 7, 1947.
