Medical Field Service School Has Birthday

The Medical Field Service School, a part of the Brooke Army Medical Center here, will celebrate its third anniversary during its organization Jan. 13 and 14.

The school will begin a two-day celebration after school hours Jan. 13. Although the actual founding of the school was Jan. 15, 1947, it was decided to move the celebration up, since the 15th fell on Sunday.

Opening of the program will be an address by Major General Joseph I. Martin, commandant, to the students and assigned personnel in the school quadrangle at 3:45 p.m. Friday.

Saturday entertainment, beginning after lunch, will start with a "first-run" showing of the movie "Twelve O'clock High," a motion picture about the Air Force. Afterward, anniversary dinners will be served at all school dining halls.

The evening program will feature games and dancing at two Brooks General Hospital Service Clubs and the M.F.S.S. Officers Club. Music will be furnished by the 323rd Army Band and by Jimmie Dedmon and his orchestra. Anniversary cakes will be cut at the club dances by Gen. Martin.

Jan. 15, 1947, all medical department schools at the center were consolidated and became Medical Field Service School. A large part of the school equipment and personnel was transferred from Carlisle Barracks, Pa., in 1948 where the original school was founded in 1920.

The story of "Nona From Nowhere" revolves about Pat Brady's adopted daughter, Nona, and Vernon Duteil, the most fabulous director in Hollywood. Twenty years before the story starts, Pat Brady saved Vernon Duteil's life. In gratitude, Vernon swore to grant any request Pat might make of him at any time, if it were within his power. The radio series starts when Pat appears at Vernon's motion picture studio to request fulfillment of the promise, made when Vernon was 18 years old. "Nona From Nowhere" will be heard over a C.B.S. network of 149 stations. The series is sponsored by B. T. Babbitt, Inc., and will be administered by Air Features, Inc. KTSA-2 P.M.

THE IRONY OF A MAN'S VISION OF THINGS TO COME, INCLUDING THE FATE of his brother-in-law and wife, is the theme of "The Man Who Couldn't Lose" on the "Lights Out" television series over WOAI-TV Monday. Narrated by Jack La Rue, the show will star Dean Harens, as the man who could foresee the future, and Alfredo Wallace, as his worried but faithful wife. WOAI-TV-8 P.M.

AS A WANTED MURDERER, BLACK MAILED BY A GIRL WHO HAS PHOTO-graphic evidence of his latest crime, Larry Haines stars in John Roeburt's original thriller, "Killer at Large," on C.B.S.'s "Inner Sanctum" Monday. She browbeats the killer into accompanying her on a perilous 14,000-foot climb to the home of an old hermit, reputed to have taken a huge amount of cash with him when he retreated from life. Hi Brown produces and directs the series and Paul McGrath serves as Your Host. KTSA-7 P.M.

BARBARA STANWYCK AND BURT LANCASTER RE-ENACT THEIR ORIGINAL roles in a full-hour adaptation of the screen hit, "Sorry, Wrong Number," based on Lucille Fletcher's C.B.S. "Suspense" classic on C.B.S.'s "Lux Radio Theater" Monday. Miss Stanwyck is heard as the terror-stricken invalid, Mrs. Stevenson, who hears of her husband's plot against her life in a crossed-wire telephone conversation. As she frantically tries to call the police, the grim menace of death creeps nearer and nearer in an emotional sequence of power and drama which makes the story a masterpiece of fiction. "Sorry, Wrong Number" was first played on "Suspense" in May, 1943, and has been repeated by popular demand many times since. William Keighley produces "Lux Radio Theater." Louis Silvers conducts the music. John Milton Kennedy announces. KTSA-8 P.M.

CLIFFORD CURZON, DISTINGUISHED BRITISH PIANIST, WILL be guest soloist on the "Telephone Hour" Monday. This will mark his second appearance on the program this season. The highlight of Curzon's portion of the program will be the finale of Brahms' "Concerto No. 1 in D Minor." This work originally was conceived by Brahms as a symphony and was later completed as a piano concerto. It still maintains the symphonic influence with careful balance of piano and orchestra. Two short solos selected by Curzon are Schubert's "Moment Musical No. 3" and Dohnanyi's "Capriccio in F Minor." Donald Voorhees will direct the Bell Symphony Orchestra in "Erotik" by Grieg, taken from his third book of "Lyric Pieces for Piano," and the colorful "Cavatina" by Raff. WOAI-8 P.M.

THE FIRST PERFORMANCE OF A COMPOSITION WRITTEN EXPRESSLY for "orchestra and television camera" will be conducted by Howard Barlow on N.B.C.'s "Voice of Firestone" simulcast program Monday. The work, titled "Laughter," is a scherzo for orchestra and camera. It was composed and orchestrated by Lee Bristol, Jr., stage manager of the "Voice of Firestone" and other N.B.C. television shows. Bristol, an accomplished pianist and organist, wrote the piece after Barlow mentioned his desire to find a composer with a knowledge of television and camera work to orchestrate music specially for the new medium. Jan Pearce, Metropolitan Opera tenor, will be guest vocalist on the program. He will sing "Thine Alone," from Herbert's "Elielen," "Vesti La Giubba," from Leoncavallo's "Pagliacci," "Younger Than Springtime," from South Pacific, and "Rossini's 'La Danza.'" WOAI-7:30 P.M.
