### History of Western Culture In Exhibit to Open at College

An exhibit of the history of Western culture, entitled "1848," will open Wednesday at Our Lady of the Lake College and will continue through January 20 sponsored by the college's art department.

Prepared by the editors of Life magazine, "1848" depicts that crucial year of the 19th century which some historians have called "the turning point of history at which history didn't turn."

Using material from the article "1848" which appeared in Life, the 24-panel exhibition is expanded beyond the article and includes many pictures from 19th Century periodicals and other sources contemporary with the period.

Attempting to describe something of the complex nature of the events which culminated in that turbulent year, "1848" is divided into five sections: England and Industrialism; France; Austria; Italy; and Germany. The title panel is a color reproduction of Delacroix's "Liberty Leading the People" and is followed by a portrait of Prince Metternich and a painting of the diplomats at the Congress of Vienna.

The exhibit, to be held in the St. Florence Library art gallery, will be open to the public.

### Columbia Signs Arthur Godfrey For Long Term

**"One-Man Industry" Said to Have 40 Million Listeners**

The Columbia Broadcasting System and Arthur M. Godfrey have concluded a long-term agreement under which he will continue his radio and television performances exclusively on the CBS network, it was announced Monday by Frank Stanton, president.

The agreement was negotiated for Godfrey by C. Leo DeOrsey of Washington, D.C. James M. Seward, CBS vice-president, represented the network. Godfrey has been called by Variety "one of the major phenomena of his era and a one-man industry." His weekly audience is estimated at more than 40 million people. It has been said that Arthur Godfrey "goes into more homes in America every morning than the milkman."
