On the Air Waves

Britain Seeking Cloth to Filter Out Atom Rays

NEC's Merrill Mueller reported from London this week that Britain is developing "an atomic cloth which threatens an upheaval in family fashions over the next few years."

British scientists have confirmed that experiments are being conducted with plastic material, seeking the ideal cloth to mask the human body from dangerous radio-active rays which results from atomic blasts, Mueller said.

The real purpose of the experiments, the newsmen said, was to find a suitable uniform for civil defense teams now being trained in Britain in event of atomic warfare. But, he added, the cloth could also be used to line bomb shelters, household rooms, or the interiors of warships.

Mueller stated that news of the experiments have caused an "impact" in fashion circles. One London designer said it eventually will mean an "atomic suit" for every member of the family. Another designer said that such security consciousness would mean the end of low neck lines, short sleeves and short-hem lines in women's clothes.

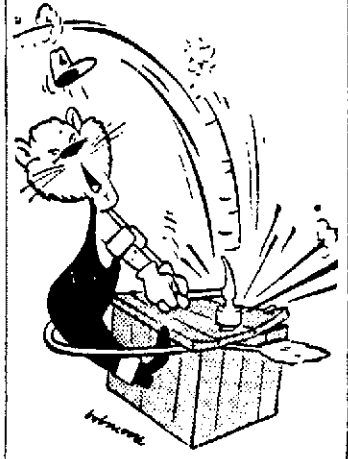
