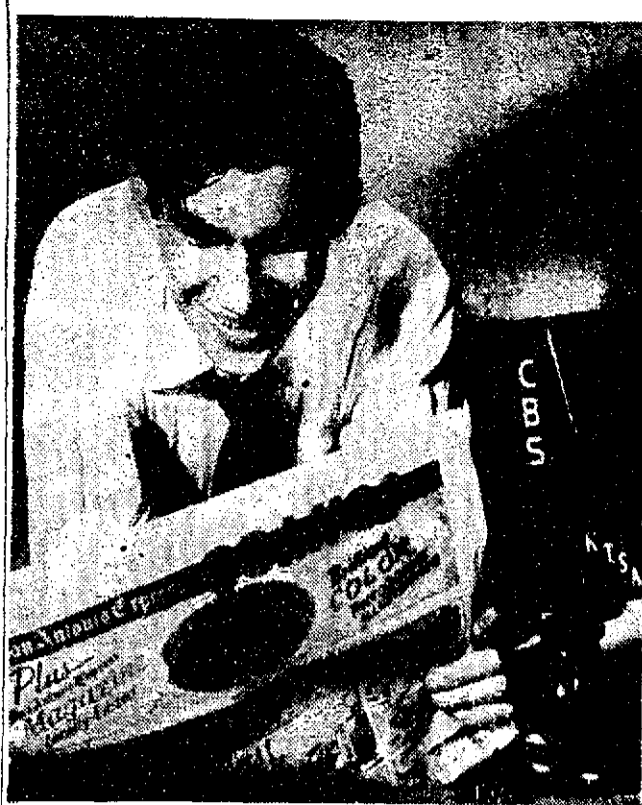

Computation of Overtime Pay Aired on KTSA

New methods of computing overtime pay under the federal wage and hour law amendments will be explained for employers and employees in this area by a government official during a special program to be broadcast at 2 p.m. Saturday by Station KTSA.

Jack G. High, who represents the wage and hour and public contracts divisions, U.S. Department of Labor, in this area, will be the speaker on the second of a series of special programs dealing with the amendments recently enacted by Congress.

He will explain how the new amendments clarify such problems as the "overtime on overtime" issue raised in the longshore industry, what constitutes true overtime pay and what constitutes premium pay; how to compute pay for excused absences and for certain days of the workweek, and the first definition for the term, "regular rate of pay."

Market Square Work Approved

City council Thursday approved an \$18,296.45 contract with the Kelly Construction Company for the paving and improvement of the Washington Square area.

Covered with chug holes large enough to cause frequent broken axles on trucks using the market, the paved area has been in bad need of repair for a number of years.

It will be necessary for the city council to amend the budget for the current year in order to set up the project and provide for payment. The sum of only \$10,000 was provided in the budget of Parks and Sanitation Com. Henry Heim for the paving, and his budget will be amended to include the extra \$8,000.
