Hillsboro FHA Initiates 14 Freshman Girls

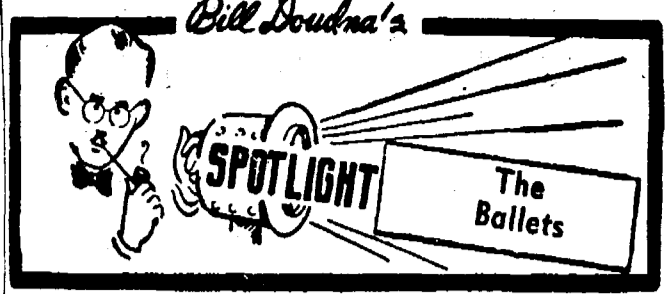

Every seat has been sold for the three ballet performances scheduled here Saturday, Monday, and Tuesday. Ballet Theater will be at the Parkway theater Saturday night and the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo will be at the Wisconsin Union theater Monday and Tuesday nights. Because of this obvious interest in ballet, Madison should like an unusual book venture—the simultaneous publication of a book in two formats under two titles. In the paper-bound Mentor edition, it is "Ballet;" in the standard-size volume, it is "Ballet in America."

The book is by George Amberg, theater arts consultant at the Museum of Modern Art and lecturer in the arts at New York university. It is the first comprehensive story of the ballet in the United States, beginning with the appearance of John Durang in Philadelphia in 1785 and continuing to mid-1949. It's a comprehensive volume, with detailed information on the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo and Ballet Theater, as well as on companies which preceded them. In it are well-written summaries of many ballets, an excellent chronology, details on the repertoires of more than a dozen companies, and notes on the dancers. A unique feature is the complete libretto of "Fancy Free," incorporated in one of the chapters on Ballet Theater.
