RADIO PROGRAMS AND PERSONALITIES

SYMON GOLDBERG, DISTINGUISHED POLISH VIOLINIST, MAKES HIS FIRST NATIONAL BROADCAST in this country when he plays with the New York Philharmonic-Symphony, under the baton of Dimitri Mitropoulos, on CBS Sunday, Jan. 15. Goldberg will be heard in the Beethoven Concerto for Violin and Orchestra in D Major, Opus 61, for which he uses a version somewhat different from the one usually played. From a photostat of the Beethoven manuscript, now in Vienna, the violinist found about 80 bars which the composer had written in variance with the traditional version. Mitropoulos will lead the orchestra in the American radio premiere of Roger Sessions' Symphony No. 2, dedicated to the memory of the late Franklin D. Roosevelt, whose death occurred while Mr. Sessions was working on the slow movement. It was first performed in January 1947 by the San Francisco Symphony under Montoux. Chosen in 1949 for the newly established Naumberg Composer's Award, the symphony will be recorded under the auspices of the Walter W. Naumberg Foundation. KTSA—2:30 P.M. (FM); 10:30-12 P.M. (AM)

In Charlie's script, he finds Jolson as a bum singing on street corners. He offers him a job if he'll stop his corny type of crooning and go modern. Jolson blows his top. KTSA—7 P.M.

DANA ANDREWS WILL HEADLINE "GEORGE WASHINGTON SLEPT HERE," STAGE and film comedy hit on CBS' "Family Hour of Stars" program Sunday. KTSA—5 P.M.

FOR THE FIRST TIME IN ITS NEW SERIES, MUTUAL'S "SYLVAN LEVIN OPERA CONCERT" program Sunday will present soprano Paula Lenchner and bass Jerome Hines as guest soloists. Both are Metropolitan Opera stars. The program, moves to this new time period effective with Sunday's broadcast. KMAC—7:30 P.M.

"INVITATION TO LEARNING" DEVOTES THE THIRD PROGRAM IN its 13-week series on "The Search for Faith" to a discussion of the Avesta, sacred books of the ancient Persian religion of Zoroastrianism, on Sunday. Godfrey Watches Two Big Events

Arthur Godfrey will celebrate two important anniversaries on Sunday.

An enthusiastic good will ambassador for flying today, Godfrey "hitched" his first airplane ride on a F5L flying boat while serving in the Navy, on Jan. 15, 1920. Since then, he has piloted aircraft ranging from a glider to the Navy's huge Constitution.

On Jan. 15, 1934, he began his fabulous career with C.B.S. via the network's Washington outlet, WTOP.

Currently, the C.B.S. star shuttles each week between his Virginia farm home and New York in his Twin-Beech plane, which he pilots himself. He also has a four-place Navion.

He took up flying seriously in 1928, and in 1934 became a licensed land and water private pilot. Since his first flight in 1920, Godfrey estimates he has logged more than 3,000 hours although, he says, "I really haven't kept a log. I'm too dog-goned lazy."

Godfrey's interest in flying is well known to the estimated weekly 40,000,000 listeners and viewers of his radio and television programs. An exponent of safety in flying, Godfrey has become the "unofficial" spokesman for the industry and has received many commendations for advancing interest and safety in flying.
