### Historical Assn. To Mark 10th Anniversary

The San Antonio Historical Association will observe its tenth anniversary Wednesday night with a banquet at the Menger Hotel. Highlight of the program is the address by John D. Wheeler, president. His topic is "San Patricio de Ibernia," a history of the early Irish settlements in Texas.

Organized to perpetuate the memory and spirit of the builders of Texas, particularly those of San Antonio, the association has grown from a small group to a membership of over 150 persons who hold monthly meetings in the Cos House.

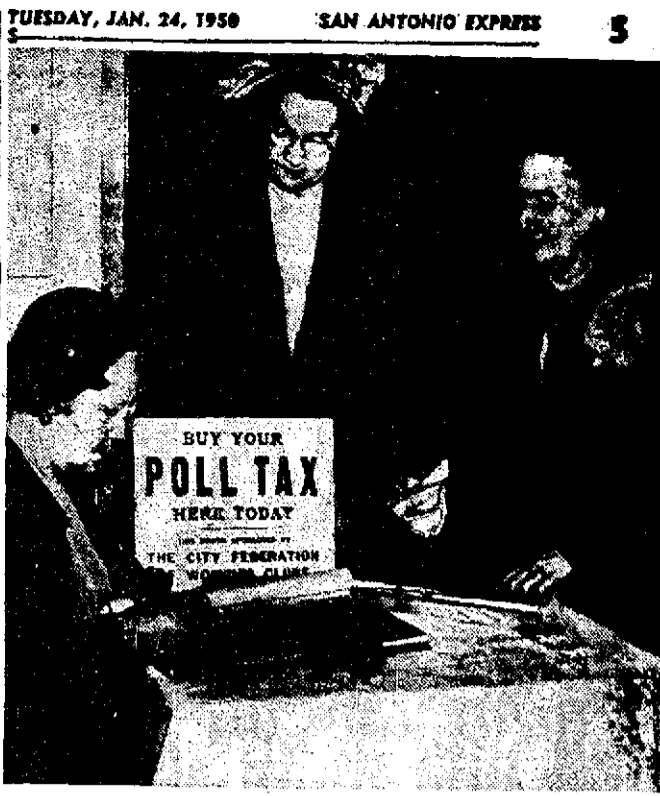
An examination of the membership reveals a cross-cut section of San Antonio citizens, including university and college professors, teachers, clergymen, doctors, lawyers, businessmen, Army officers, and housewives. Many members are professional and amateur historians who have written books and articles on Texas history.

The association is recognized as one of the most active historical societies in Texas. It has assisted in the organization of other societies in the state, and its members frequently read papers at the annual meeting of the Texas State Historical Association in Austin and contribute to The Southwestern Historical Quarterly, official publication of the state association.

Several members from San Antonio have served as state officers. Dr. P. I. Nixon is a past president of the state organization.

The 10 presidents of the association have been Dr. Joseph W. Schmitz, Dr. Nixon, Chis Emmett, C. Stanley Banks, Paul Adams, Col. M. L. Crimmins, Joe O. Naylor, George Isbell, Miss Frances Donecker, and John D. Wheeler.

### VISITING MUSICIAN SETS SERIES OF BAND CLINICS

Band clinics will be conducted at a number of San Antonio high schools for the next four days by Clarence Sawhill, associate professor of music and director of bands at the University of Southern California at Los Angeles.

Arrangements for Sawhill's visit to San Antonio were made by G. Lewis Doll, director of music education in the San Antonio schools. A college classmate of Doll, he is a house guest at the Doll home, 323 W. Agarta St.

Tuesday Sawhill will conduct band clinics at Edison High School and Burbank High School. On Wednesday he will be at Jefferson High School and will work at Brackett High School Thursday. His last day, Friday, will be spent at Alamo Heights High School and Harlandale High School. Sawhill is enroute to Corpus Christi where on Friday and Saturday he will direct the band clinic for Region Seven of the Texas Interscholastic League.

Doll announced that any San Antonio band director would be welcome to attend the clinics conducted here by Sawhill.

Sawhill is now in his third year at the California school, Doll said, after teaching a number of years at the University of Illinois.

"As one of the most popular high school band clinicians in the country, Sawhill has made appearances in 35 states during the last few years," Doll said.
