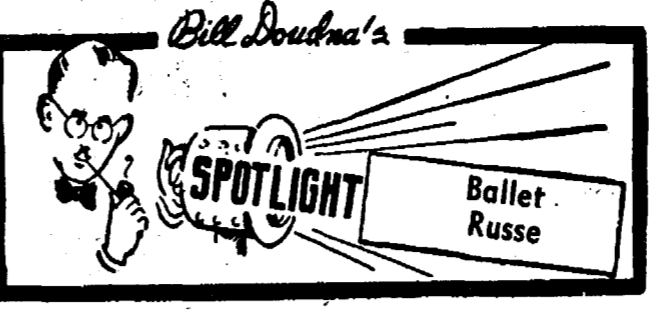

TIP O' THE MORNING: Now that Columbia is ready to release its Elliot Lawrence version, you can expect a rash of "Ritual Fire Dance" recordings by other top bands... Incidentally, Artie Shaw has left Columbia for Decca.

The brilliance and vitality of Alexandra Danilova; the calm and assured artistry of Frederic Franklin; the charm and good humor of Nina Novak, and the clean-cut but warm classicism of Mary Ellen Moylan were the chief characteristics of Monday night's performance by the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo.

The ballet opened a two-day engagement in the Wisconsin Union theater, where a second capacity audience will greet the company at 8 tonight. This will be the third such crowd in four days, for Ballet Theater filled the Parkway theater Saturday night.

Mme. Danilova performed magnificently in her new version of "Paquita," first seen more than a century ago but made new and shining by this production. The top star of the company danced with youthful zest, setting the pace for the rest of the dancers and matching the brilliance of the costuming.

Oleg Tupine was her partner, as he was Miss Moylan in the opening "Ballet Imperial." A young man of promise, Tupine appears to need a course in loosening up before he can fulfill it.

Miss Moylan, given the leading role in "Ballet Imperial," danced superbly. She has everything that a ballet star needs, with the possible exception of long experience. A warm personality enhances her performance.

Franklin appeared only in "Pas de Deux Classique," with Miss Novak. His floating leaps were breath-taking in their faultless execution, and his dancing as a whole was more than satisfying. Miss Novak was a competent partner, but she scored even more with a sprightly sense of humor in "Graduation Ball."

Gertrude Tyven showed versatility and precision in all three of the large works, but was so intent that her dancing lacked feeling for the theater.

The corps de ballet had a bad time for a while in "Ballet Imperial," there were three distinct falls, and what appeared to be an attack of nerves infected even some of the principals. But all of them came out of it for the rest of the evening.

Lucien Calliet and Paul Strauss shared the baton, but neither was able to extract much brilliance from the orchestra. Rachel Chapman did well with the Tchaikow-

Milwaukee Judge Cleared of Charges

Atty. Gen. Thomas E. Fairchild Monday cleared Circuit Judge William I. O'Neill, Milwaukee, of a charge of improper reporting of his expenses during his campaign last spring.

But, Fairchild said, the expense report of a club supporting O'Neill was questionable. He said there were "substantial discrepancies" in the club's report which "if left unexplained constitute prima facie evidence of a violation of the law."

He turned over information on the club's expenses to Milwaukee Dist. Atty. William McClauley to "take such action as he deems appropriate."

Fairchild refused to start a special investigation of O'Neill's campaign expenses.

Milwaukee Orders Search for Councilman

MILWAUKEE (U.P.)—Dist. Atty. William McClauley ordered a nationwide search late Monday for Albert Krause, councilman who resigned suddenly Tuesday night and disappeared.

McClauley said he wants to investigate Krause's resignation because of many rumors about the incident. The district attorney ordered circulars distributed across the country saying that Krause is wanted for questioning.

The council member took his resignation to Council Pres Milton McGuire at 10 p. m. last Tuesday. He said he was leaving the city to take another job.

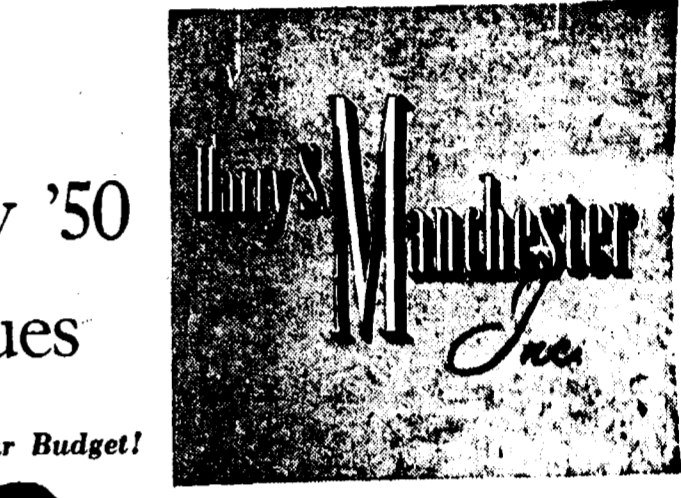
