Wage-Hour Law Changes to Be Aired Saturday

Changes in the Fair Labor Standards Act (Federal wage and hour law) which set up three tests for determining whether retail or service establishments are exempt from the wage and hour provisions of the act will be explained during a special program to be broadcast at 2 p.m. Saturday over KTSA.

Jack G. High, who represents the Wage and Hour and Public Contracts Divisions, U.S. Department of Labor, in this area, will be the speaker.

He will also explain exemptions for employees of certain logging operators; certain agricultural irrigation companies; public telephone exchanges; small daily and weekly newspapers; laundries, cleaning plants, bakeries, candy kitchens and other types of businesses.

The program will be the third in a special series dealing with the amendments, effective Jan. 23.

Coverage Set For British Elections

NBC's news and special events department will offer extensive coverage of the British national elections, to be held Feb. 23, the first general elections since 1945.

Although each major news program will report developments in England daily until the British go to the polls, special programs will bring NBC listeners comprehensive coverage of the issues involved, the candidates and events which may affect the outcome of the elections.

NBC's Western European news staff will cover the elections, with Edwin Haaker from Germany and Henry Cassidy from France joining Merrill Mueller and Ed Newman in London.

FAMED 19TH CENTURY ART SHOWN AT WITTE

The San Antonio Art League will open a rare exhibit of paintings by Winslow Homer and Eastman Johnson Wednesday, in the galleries of the Witte Museum. On view through Jan. 29, the collection has been lent by Wildenstein Galleries of New York City, and it is the first time the works of these two 19th century American artists are being shown in San Antonio.

Born in Boston in 1836, the self-taught Homer believed that painting is the art of seeing. Like other naturalists, he depicted contemporary life and people around him. During the Civil War, Homer covered the front for Harper's, and besides his pictorial journalism, he treated similar subjects in his first oils, and thus gained a reputation as a painter.

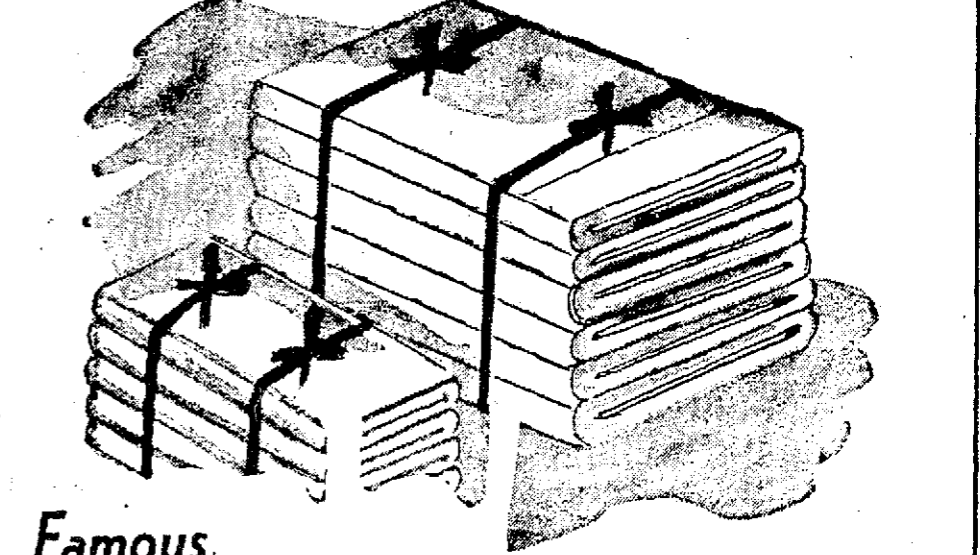
