U. W. Man Says World Attuned to Socialism

DES MOINES, Ia.—(UP)—Prof. D. D. Lescohier, Madison, Wis., told a group of Iowa ministers Tuesday that he believed the world is "in tune with the groundswell for a more socialized society."

Lescohier, a University of Wisconsin economics professor, addressed 250 clergymen attending an Iowa pastors' school. He said people should take a long range outlook on world problems.

"I believe we are in the midst of a great forward movement to a new and better state of society than we have at present," Lescohier said.
