On the Air Waves

Few New Video Stations Due to Go on Air This Year

NEW YORK. (AP) New television stations are becoming a rare item. In fact, nearly two months will have elapsed before the next one comes on the air.

That will be KEYL of San Antonio, Texas, the city's second station. It has picked Feb. 15 for the start. The previous station opening was mid-December. KEYL joins WOAI-TV and plans to operate five days a week, Wednesdays through Sundays, night time only.

The dearth in new stations is occasioned by the gradual decrease of the backlog of construction permits issued by the Federal Communications Commission. An even dozen remain. About half have announced dates between now and summer.

Issuance of new licenses has been under an FCC freeze for more than a year while it threshes out the question of the opening of new channels.

All networks have scheduled President Truman's speech at the annual Jefferson-Jackson Day Dinner in Washington. The date is Feb. 16, with air time 10:30 to 12 p. m.

No announcement has been made whether television also will join in the transmission, which is to originate from the National Guard Armory.

While Arturo Toscanini—he will be 83 on March 23—is on tour with the NBC Symphony Orchestra, scheduled for April 14 to May 27 in 19 cities, the broadcast schedule will be interrupted.

Irene Ryan, the comedienne in the Bob Hope show, is one of radio's veterans, having just passed her 15th year in show business. Early listeners will recall her as half of the old microphone team of Tim and Irene.

Young Actor Turns Talents to Video

Roddy McDowall, already well established as a screen, stage and radio star, is now branching into television.

The young star of Monogram's "Killer Shark" is now featured on the "Hi Talent Battle," televised by KLAC, Los Angeles, at 7 p. m. Wednesdays.

"Next," says Roddy, "I suppose I should take a crack at the circus. I have always wondered what it's like to be a performer under the big top."

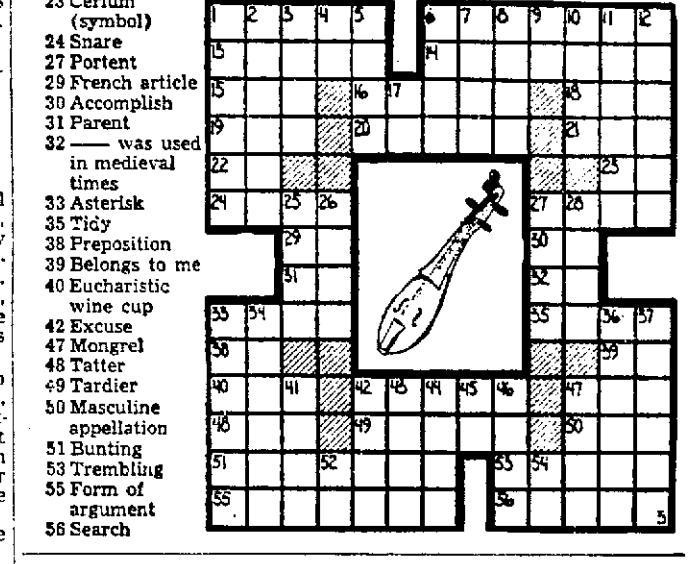

Six and Seven Card Suits Not Rare in Bridge Hands

WHEN you hold a six-card suit in your hand do not be surprised to find one or two of the other hands also holding a six or seven-card suit. One of the declarers in the national men's team-of-four last year failed to remember this and, as a result, lost his contract.

When South opened the six of clubs there should have been no question in declarer's mind but that it was the fourth best of South's longest and strongest suit. Applying the rule of 11 North held one club higher than the six spot.

It must be the king or queen, because if South held the king and queen of clubs he would have opened with the king. Also, as declarer held a six-card spade suit, South could easily hold a six-card club suit.

When the declarer made the mistake of playing low from dummy North won the trick with his singleton king. He returned a heart which dummy won with the ace. A spade was immediately led from dummy which South won with the ace. He returned the nine of clubs and North ruffed with the eight of spades. A heart was
