'Fluffs,' Flaws, and Fakery

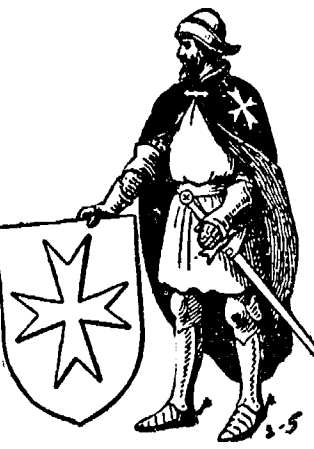

Residents Crowd Tiny Malta

If you visit Malta, you will find that many persons on the island can speak English. The natives of Malta speak Italian in school. They may speak Italian as well, but in their homes they are likely to use the language called "Maltese."



Malta is one of the most thickly settled islands in the world. It has an average of more than 2,500 persons to the square mile. The island of Hongkong, off the coast of China, and Manhattan island, a part of New York City, have far more persons than that to the square mile, but most other islands of the world are not nearly so thickly settled.



Malta is the largest of the "Maltese islands." Among the others is one called Gozo and another known as Comino.

The island of Gozo is supposed to have been a place where the ancient hero, Ulysses (also called Odysseus) spent most of his time during his long journey back to his home in Greece. The old legend says that a lovely nymph named Calypso then ruled Gozo.

Malta and the other islands of the group gave the world some terms which we may hear from time to time. These include the "Maltese Cross" and the "Maltese dog."

The Maltese cross is the old sign of the Knights of Malta. It has four "arms" or "limbs," all of the same size.

Each arm of a Maltese cross is narrow at the base and wide toward the end. At the end it is indented so as to form two points; that is why this emblem has been called "the cross of eight points."

The Maltese dog is a small animal with long hair. The hair is white and silky. Maltese dogs were named after the Maltese islands, but they are not bred there at the present time.

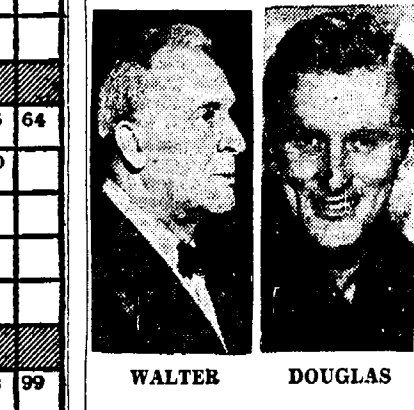
