The property at 311-15 State st., which the Sears, Roebuck and Co. store occupies, has been sold for "over \$100,000."
A. J. McCance purchased the property from the Monarch Realty Co. It was announced Thursday. The sale was made by D. J. Benedict, Madison realtor.
The structure, built in 1928, originally housed the Sears and Burkholder Music stores on the first floor and the Madison board of health and the Stanley C. Hanks Co. offices on the second floor. Sears expanded in 1935 to occupy the entire building.

State Tax Raise Hinted by Smith
MILWAUKEE — (U.P.) — Lieut. Gov. George Smith said Thursday afternoon the Wisconsin legislature may have to raise taxes or cut expenditures next year to keep the state from going into debt.
He told the Eagles luncheon club that state revenue is declining because of a drop in personal and corporate income.
Smith said it is estimated that revenue in 1949-50 will be 10 per cent lower than in 1948-49 and that state income will drop another 10 per cent in 1950-51.
