Anderson was the star of filmdom's first big hit, "The Great Train Robbery," in 1903. Said his longtime manager, Herman Budan: "Since Billy was around when movies were born, he wanted to get in on video in its infancy." As president of Progressive Pictures, Anderson intends to recall the town Dunkirk instead of give his old series, "The Old Snakeville," and such characters as Alkali Ike, Mustang Pete, Slim and Two-Gun Annie. "The series will be comedy westerns, designed to bring back the old-fashioned belly laugh," said Budan. "We originated the stagecoach holdup and the fall over the cliff. They're doing the same things today. Of course we had no singing cowboys in those days of silents. But we'll keep up with all things, a designer. He says our cowboys sing." He recalled that Bronco Billy made a picture a week for 376 weeks. In one film, Billy himself played all the characters by means of trick photography.
