Expert Says Bad Contract No Reason to Quit Trying

THE Paradise Bridge Studio, operated by Jules Tilles, in the Bronx in New York, produces a great many fine duplicate plays. In addition to selecting the annual club champion from their weekly duplicate games, the members play a great many team-of-four matches. There is no better method of strengthening your tournament and rubber bridge game than in team-of-four competition.
As Tilles pointed out, in tournament bridge, even though you find yourself in a bad contract, you do not give up. You play the hand out. Maybe the opponents will make a mistake as they did in today's hand.
East hesitated long after North's bid of one diamond, which he did not want to pass, so he hid one no trump. You cannot blame West for jumping to three no trump.
South made the normal opening of the queen of clubs, which declarer won with the ace in dummy. He had the king of diamonds and North won the trick with the ace, returning the six of spades. South won this trick with the queen and now he made a mistake. He thought his partner had the king of clubs, so he led back the nine-spot. Declarer played the 10 from dummy which held the trick.
Now declarer proceeded to cash his diamonds. I have underlined the last five cards in all four hands. When declarer led the three of diamonds South was a little embarrassed. He discarded his seven of hearts; a club was

Frenchman Sells Shares to Film Life of Christ

WASHINGTON, (AP) The Security & Exchange Commission can't understand why anybody connected with the movies would sell stock in a projected picture for as low as \$10 a share and discourage more than two shares to a customer.
The SEC looked into the matter and, although bewildered, okayed it.
Hollywood was just as mystified. Here was a motion picture in which no producer, author, director, or stars would get credit. That isn't the way Hollywood would do it, but Hollywood isn't doing this one.
It is to be produced abroad and is about the life of Christ.
In simple, reverent form, the drama will be portrayed against the backdrop of our atomic era. Three cameras will be used simultaneously. There will be screens three times larger than regulation and acoustics having as many as 75 loud speakers. Shooting will take place in France, Italy and Israel. Churches everywhere already have endorsed the idea of filming the passion of Christ.
A prominent Hollywood actress offered to play gratis the part of the mother Mary. She was turned down.
The man responsible for the idea is a dynamic young Frenchman named Count Georges de la Grandiere, who three times was a prisoner of the Nazis.
The count went to Hollywood and tried to sell his idea to the film moguls. The count went broke. He returned to France and bicycled up and down the land selling shares of stock at \$10 a share. It looks as if he's going to make it.
