On the Air Waves Ames, Iowa, TV Station to Be No. 100 in U. S.

NEW YORK. (AP) There's been a change in the television station marking itself up as the nation's 100th. It is to be WOIT-TV of Ames, Iowa, with an opening date set for Feb. 21.

The formal dedication of WSYR-TV of Syracuse, N. Y., previously indicated as No. 100, is now set for March 5. WOIT-TV, companion to radio station WOI which started in 1921, has been running test patterns since Jan. 21. Owned by Iowa State College, it rates itself as the country's first educational station.
