# Anniversary Event Set by Fourth Degree

A fourth degree initiation of the Knights of Columbus will be held in Houston as part of the national celebration of the golden anniversary of the founding of the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus Feb. 22, 1900, in New York City.

The exemplification will also serve to commemorate the 43rd anniversary of the Fourth Degree in Texas, which was founded on the same date in 1907, according to an announcement made by Dr. John C. Guenther, Master of the De Soto province, Southern District of Texas.

One hundred fifteen candidates for the honor of the fourth degree will receive the salute of 350 Fourth Degree Knights at the exemplification.

The program for the day calls for a pontifical high mass to be celebrated by the Most Rev. Louis J. Reicher, bishop of Austin, with the Most Rev. Christopher E. Bryne, bishop of Galveston, presiding. Host for the occasion is the Msgr. George A. Wilhelm, Assembly of Houston, which will be led by Claude A. Kurtin, Faithful Navigator of the Assembly. The mass will be celebrated at Annunciation Church at 8:30 a.m. and will be preceded by a parade. The exemplification will be at 1 p.m. and will be held at the Holy Rosary Parish Hall, Travis St., to be followed by a banquet to be held at the Texas State Hotel at 7 p.m.

# Two Top Ballet Stars To Be Here March 6

Two of the greatest stars of the ballet world will be featured when the Ballet Theater presents four productions beginning at 8:20 p.m. Monday, March 6 at Municipal Auditorium, sponsored by Friends of Music.

Nora Kaye and Igon Youskevitch will star in "Pas de Deux" from The Black Swan, presenting five of the most beautiful portions of the ballet to the music of Tchaikowsky. Miss Kaye is regarded as one of the brightest luminaries of the ballet field, while Youskevitch is generally considered the world's greatest contemporary male classical dancer.

Now on its seventh annual cross-country tour, the Ballet Theater also will bring to the stage Les Sylphides, Billy the Kid and Interplay, a repertory selected from 25 great ballets.

Billy the Kid is the first ballet on an American theme by an American choreographer and composer, and in the musical score will be "Git Along Little Dogies," "The Old Chisholm Trail," "Oh Bury Me Not On the Lone Prairie," "Old Paint," and others.
