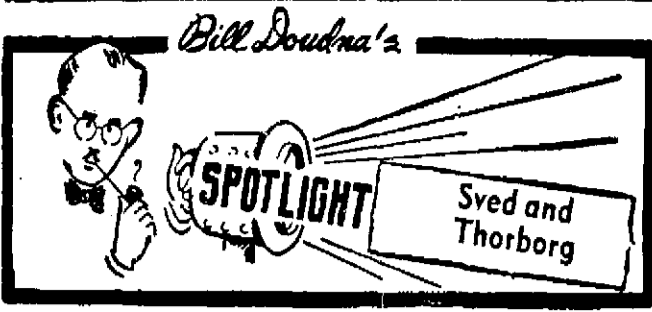

Madison had one of its rare tastes of opera Tuesday night when Kerstin Thorborg, mezzo-soprano, and Alexander Sved, baritone, sang the first of two concerts in the Wisconsin Union theater. They will repeat their program there at 8 tonight.

Most of the concert was operatic, and the arias and duets found greater favor with the audience than the songs which both the Metropolitan Opera artists offered early in the evening.

Nevertheless, two of the program's most enjoyable moments came in Mrs. Thorborg's singing of Beethoven's "Die Eyre Gottes in Natur" and Sved's work in Denza's "Occhi di Fata." The latter served perhaps better than anything else to reveal the baritone's remarkable control of his voice, notable in the closing bars' slow and quiet increase and decrease of volume.

Both singers had voices of tremendous power, and both exercised it in the duets, with keen ears for proper balance between them. However, they appeared to miss a conductor; occasionally they parted ways as phrases ended.

Mrs. Thorborg seemed somewhat nervous; perhaps the grueling season of opera through which she has just gone accounts for that. Her voice alone was better able than her staccato body movements to tell the stories of her songs and arias. It is a rich and facile voice, as well as a powerful one.

Hit of the evening was Sved's singing of "Largo al Cielito," an encore. Here he let loose a wealth of acting ability and a fine bent for comedy. His "Eri Tu" also brought hearty applause.

Mrs. Thorborg's encores were Spang's "Morning" (the only number sung in English) and a Grieg song.

The Wisconsin Union Concert series, of which these programs are a part, will continue Mar. 10 and 11 with the Minneapolis Symphony orchestra.
