On the Air Waves Networks Hunt New Shows; Sarah Churchill on Program

NEW YORK. (AP) Anticipating that a lot of programs will be needed to fill in next summer's gaps on the radio, the networks already have gone to work on ideas. Some are fairly well set. Among these is a Sammy Kaye traveling talent show which NBC is to introduce. Talent will be obtained by asking disc jockeys of affiliated stations to hold auditions. Sammy will put on the program from the studio of a different station each week. Sarah Churchill, daughter of the former British prime minister, will have the lead for the Family Drama when its sponsor bids goodbye to his CBS audience today. This program and its predecessor have been running at the same Sunday evening time for nearly a decade. Miss Churchill, who recently made a couple of appearances in "Leave It to the Girls" on NBC television, will take the same role that Katherine Hepburn portrayed when the play, "The Philadelphia Story," was on Broadway. Family Drama has been on the air since October, 1948, when it succeeded the Family Concert. The concert began in 1941, and its sponsor, Glady's Swarthout and Patrice Munsel, its predecessor have been running regular groups of programs.

Boy Scouts Launch Drive for Miss Liberty Replicas

When NBC commentator Alexander Dreier puts his bulk behind a crusade, something's got to give. Dreier is happy to report that his recent broadcast about the Boy Scouts' campaign to place a replica of the Statue of Liberty in every American community has resulted in his listeners giving a \$300,000 push to the Scouts' crusade. Dreier first became interested in the Boy Scouts' movement to bring America's most famous lady to every hamlet in the land when he addressed a recent meeting of Scout adult leaders in Kansas City. There he met and talked with a Kansas City industrialist, Jack Whittaker. Whittaker spent \$6000 to hire a sculptor to make the mold for eight and a half foot tall copper replicas of the Statue of Liberty. Set on a base, the replicas stand 15 feet high and are available at the manufacturer's cost. Dreier immediately purchased one of the replicas for his hometown of Honolulu and within a few days after his NBC broadcast 100 orders had been received from individual citizens, communities, chambers of commerce and other civic groups.
