

Listeners tuned into a sports program over station KECA Saturday night were startled

by a voice that broke in and said: ."We interrupt this broadcast to bring you a special an-nouncement." The speaker accused the sta-

tion of hiring engineers on a

six-month provisional basis and then firing them. He was cut off the air by the master con-trol engineer.

American Broadcasting Co-officials, with which KECA is affiliated, identified the speaker as Engineer Roy Flook, a tem-porary employe who had been given notice two weeks ago that

he was being fired Saturday after six months work. "Flook broke all ethics for engineers," said ABC executive Frank Samuels. "I've never heard of anything like this in

all my years in radio."
Richard Moore of the ABC said the station operates in accordance with a contract with the Association of Broadcast Engineers and Technicians which permits a probationary period of six months.
