Dianna Foster, sophomore from Bay Village, O., and Jerry McNeely, graduate student from Cape Girardeau, Mo., will have the leads in "Still Life." This will be Miss Foster's debut with the Players; McNeely was in "The Devil's Disciple" and "The Father."

MacEachron last summer played the chorus in "Antigone" and directed "The Lady of Larkspur Lotion." Zoerb is a newcomer to Players cast.
