Video Networks Grant Pay Boost

NEW YORK. (AP) The major radio and television networks have agreed to new salary minimums for their staff directors, who had threatened to strike unless their demands were met.
The agreement, which still is to be ratified by members of the A. F. of L. Radio and Television Directors Guild, was reached by negotiators last night after a five-hour meeting.
Four major networks and station WOR agreed to a \$145-a-week minimum for directors, and a \$100-a-week minimum for associate directors.
Previous pay was reported to be \$130 a week for directors and \$75 weekly for assistants.
The guild originally had demanded a \$200 weekly minimum for video directors, and \$300 for television directors.
The union said the main stumbling block to agreement was removed when the networks granted staff directors working on commercial shows extra compensation of 80 per cent of the standard freelance rates.
Mabel Leslie of the state board of mediation, said the networks also agreed for the first time to include company policies on pensions, vacations, holidays, and similar issues in the contract.

Broadcasts Play to Art Godfrey

NEW YORK. (AP) Arthur Godfrey claims broadcasting is play and not work. That's why he can put in so many hours of it a week, along with such other activities as farming, flying and the like.
Godfrey turned after dinner speaker for this week's luncheon of the Radio Executives Club and handled that assignment as nonchalantly as he does his radio and television chores.
As to broadcasting and telecasting so much, he didn't think he is overdoing himself. He said he is on the air now only 12 hours a week compared to a previous 28. He has no particular talent, he added; he just surrounds himself with the best he can find.
He thinks television and radio should be complementary; that his own tele shows should be more or less a photograph of radio to satisfy the curiosity of listeners clamoring for studio tickets.

'Catholic Hour' to Observe Twentieth Anniversary

NEW YORK. (AP) One of the oldest of the network religious programs, "The Catholic Hour," a 30-minute Sunday evening NBC series, soon is to have its 20th anniversary.
The personality most directly associated with the program in all those years in the Right Rev. Monsignor Fulton J. Sheen. He was elevated to that post some years after he appeared as the first regular speaker on the air. He has returned every year since.
The broadcast opened over 17 NBC in cooperation with the National Council of Catholic Men. Milton Berle continues No. 1 one Sunday and that was for a special broadcast in January. His percentage was 64, a gain of nearly 10 points.
However, Arthur Godfrey is pressing hard with his two shows. Talent Scouts was second and his Wednesday night hour was third after gaining one place. Toast of the Town dropped to fourth from third, while Stop the Music, making a renewed series of addresses, was fifth after jumping from seventh.
