Video Networks Grant Pay Boost NEW YORK. (#) The major

radio and television networks

have agreed to new salary mini-

mums for their staff directors, who had threatened to strike unless their demands were met. The agreement, which still is to be ratified by members of the A. F. of L. Radio and Television Directors Guild, was reached by

egotiators last night after a five-hour meeting.

Four major networks and station WOR agreed to a \$145-a-week minimum for directors, and a \$100-a-week minimum for asso-

ciate directors.

Previous pay was reported to he \$130 a week for directors and \$75 weekly for assistants.

The guild originally had demanded a \$200 weekly minimum for radio directors, and \$300 for

television directors. The union said the main stumbling block to agreement was re-moved when the networks granted staff directors working on commercial shows extra com-






