Broadway Theater Heavy With Plays of Tragic Themes

NEW YORK, (UP) Not since Elmer Rice's tense dramas of 1929, "Street Scene" and "Subway," has Broadway seen such a parade of serious plays as those now on the boards. "Come Back, Little Sheba" and "All You Need is One Good Break" recently arrived to join such recent serious dramatic successes as "Death of a Salesman," "Detective Story," "Lost in the Stars" and "Member of the Wedding." And "All You Need is One Good Break" folded quickly. In "Come Back, Little Sheba," William Inge has written a fine drama which the Theater Guild has equipped with a cast headed by Sidney Blackmer, Shirley Booth and Joan Loring. The sole commentary to this play is that it is a depressing, frustrated story in the tragic mood of "Death of a Salesman." "DOC" IS DREAMER Inge has done character sketches to form his play, his Doc being a one-time physician who is a dreamer and who lost the privileges of his profession. His marriage is one of necessity to a girl named Lola who has a good heart but still has a roving eye. She is looking to the man, or any male who may happen in, but she still loves Doc and, in her own fashion, is true to him. Doc, who is never identified by any other name, has become a chiropractor because he has been deprived of his physician's privileges. His own failure makes him feel that his wife has failed him because she is now a fat caricature of the girl he married. He is now blaming his own shortcomings on his wife who is an understanding, although dumb, girl. It gives him an escape and his generous wife is willing to permit him that privilege. Doc sees a possible chance to recapture romance with Marie, a young girl who is rooming in their house and who regards Doc and his wife like father and mother. He is frustrated here again and takes to liquor which quickly brings him into the hands of Alcoholics Anonymous. It is an excellent documentary play and with Miss Booth giving one of her most humorous performances. As a comedienne, she is undoubtedly the topmost laugh-maker among the feminine sex since Jean Dixon went to Hollywood.
