Bill Doudna's SPOTLIGHT Pro Arte Quartet

TIP O' THE MORNING: Ringling Brothers-Barnum and Bailey circus opens soon in New York's Madison Square Garden—and don't be surprised if this is the last time. The current lease ends this year, and two of the major stockholders in Cole Brothers circus are also major Garden stockholders. Bill (Hopalong Cassidy) Boyd also owns a chunk of the Cole show, and will spend part of the 1950 season with it.

One of the rewards of living in Madison is the frequent opportunity of hearing the Pro Arte quartet of the University of Wisconsin. Only a couple of hundred listeners collected their reward Sunday night when the quartet played in Music Hall.

The group established its early fame by introducing new music and the present membership emphasizes rarely-heard works in its concerts here and over the country. It does not, however, neglect Beethoven, Brahms, and the other composers of the 18th and 19th centuries. It may be paradoxical, and it may not, but Messrs. Krosch, Rabier, Milofsky, and Friedlander are best in Beethoven and the Schoenberg school.

Young, director of the governor's division of departmental research, will speak at the same hours Wednesday. Sen. Gaylord Nelson (D-Madison) will be quizzed on "Wisconsin Press Conference" at 4 p. m. Wednesday.

A new "Morning Farm Program" will go on the air at 7 a. m. daily beginning Mar. 13.
