Today's Lesson Is Fifth on Trump Coup Technique

THIS is the fifth of a series of articles on trump coups. On the opening lead of the eight diamonds, declarer played the jack from dummy and West's king held the trick. West returned a small diamond, hoping that his partner could ruff, but dummy's nine won the trick. Declarer returned the six of spades from dummy and finessed the ten-spot, which held. A small club was led and dummy's jack finessed. When it held, the four of spades was played from dummy; declarer finessed the jack and East's nine

dropped, warning declarer that the two remaining trumps were in the West hand. North now led his heart and East went in with the ace. If East returned a club, it would be into declarer's queen. He elected to return a small heart. The ten was played from dummy, and although this was a winning card, declarer realized that he must shorten his hand in trump; so he deliberately discarded a trump on dummy's good ten of hearts. He then led a small diamond and won in dummy with the ace. The king of hearts was played and the six of diamonds discarded by declarer. Then the good queen of diamonds was led from dummy. West refused to trump, discarding the six of clubs, and declarer discarded the nine of clubs.
