Cuddeback didn't have the \$5 fee and Justice William E. Ogley performed the ceremony on his promise to settle on his first pay day.

That Ogley charged a month later, went by without any payment.

Ogley, acting as justice, issued a warrant to Cuddeback, as a private citizen, charging non-payment of a debt.

Police arrested Cuddeback but released him pending a study of the legal complications involved in the warrant. In the meantime, a settlement was made.

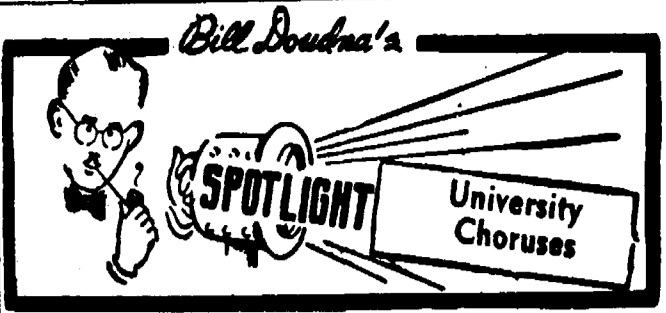

BLACKHAWK, Colo. — (U.M.) — A 68-year-old lady miner named Mrs. "Clear Creek Annie" Davis dug in Sunday at her mountain shack with a double-barrelled shotgun and defied the state of Colorado to build a highway through her property.

Highway Engineer Mark U. Watrous admitted that Mrs. Davis "has unyielded" in the efforts to build a \$3,500,000 highway through Clear Creek canyon.

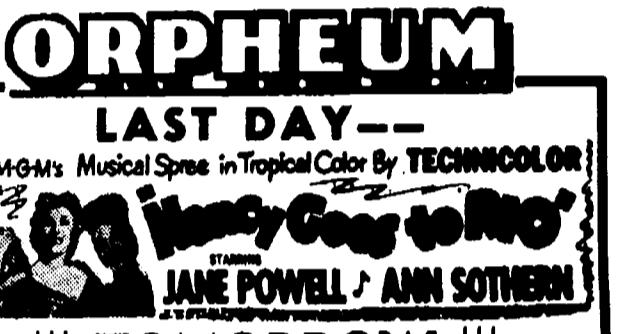
She set up a 24-hour watch over her land—claimed by squatter's rights—in the battle to keep possession of her shanty fortress.

The rebuilt railroad car lay directly in the path of the right-of-way routed as a fork to Idaho Springs and Blackhawk in the main road from Denver.

The one-time student at the Colorado School of Mines at Golden brushed off all attempts by highway representatives to "talk this thing over."

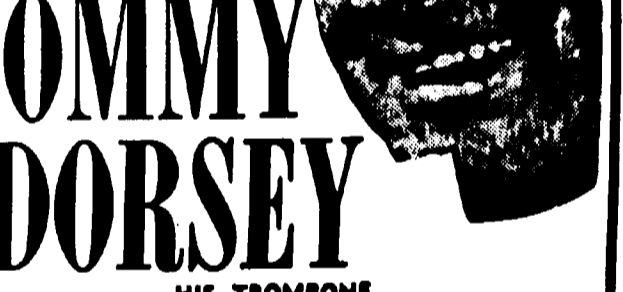
"There's treachery here and everywhere, boys," she declared. "The good Lord gave me guns to protect myself with. I'm going to get them now."
